
Mapping Our Community A Look At Seniors



Aging in Kansas City: A Community View

This special map booklet focuses on those in our community who are seniors, primarily age 65 and older.

These seniors may be active and working, or infirm and frail. They may own a home or be looking to downsize and relocate.

It all depends.

The maps, which focus primarily on Jackson, Clay and Platte counties, show a surprising degree of variability and, in some instances, provide new confirmation of long-standing trends.

The maps utilize a wealth of data from the U.S. Census Bureau American Community Survey, which is conducted every year to provide up-to-date information about the social and economic needs of communities.

The American Community Survey "shows how people live – our education, housing, jobs and more."

The maps show areas where seniors live, income levels, and areas with ready access to food and health services. We have also focused, in particular, on grandparents who are taking care of their grandchildren.

The data are based on census tracts, which are small geographic areas, usually with 2,500 to 8,000 persons.

This map booklet is part of a continuing commitment by the Local Investment Commission (LINC) to produce and publish community maps that provide valuable information for those who are interested in the neighborhood, community or broader region.

Other recent map booklets include **2010 Demographic Data by School District: Income, race** and ethnicity of school-age children.

LINC is currently working to make maps available online and allow users to produce customized map by selecting data variables and layers.


